

## Topic: Seasons

Task 1	<p>Look at the Seasons powerpoint.</p> <p>What season am I? powerpoint</p> <p>Make a seasons wheel to show how the seasons go around and are a continuous cycle using the Seasons wheel sheet.</p> <p>Children label the seasons and stick a picture to match each season.</p> <p>Day 1 of the Weather chart.</p>
Task 2	<p>Seasons powerpoint recap.</p> <p>Which months are in which season? Look at powerpoint.</p> <p>Ask your child questions about the seasons, e.g. what month is it now? What season is it? What month is Christmas? What season is it in? what month is your birthday? What season is that in?</p> <p>Wordsearch.</p> <p>Day 2 of the Weather chart.</p>
Task 3	<p>Seasons powerpoint.</p> <p>What do we do in each season?</p> <p>Sort pictures to match each season.</p> <p>Day 3 of the Weather chart.</p>
Task 4	<p>Seasons powerpoint recap.</p> <p>Match clothes to the different seasons. When would we wear this? Why? Because it keeps us warm, protects us from the sun etc.</p> <p>Draw a person in summer and winter and what they would need to be wearing. Draw or stick on.</p> <p>Alternatively, you could choose clothes from your wardrobe that you would wear in summer or winter and take photographs of you wearing them.</p> <p>Day 4 of the Weather chart.</p>

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Task 5	<p>Look at pictures of trees in different seasons. Can you see any trees from your house? What do they look like?</p> <p>Draw a tree in each season. What is the same/different? Look at lots of images to support. You could use pencil, crayons, paint or any other art materials you have at home.</p>
Task 6	<p>Children begin to make their own seasons book. Recap each season with the appropriate powerpoint, and talk about the differences between them.</p> <p>Children write about summer (Summer writing sheet) and draw pictures of things we do/ need/ see in that season. Sentences to explain weather, wildlife, trees, plants, length of the day.</p> <p>For example, In the summer it is hot. The sun is high in the sky. I see lots of flowers growing etc.</p>
Task 7	Repeat as above for autumn.
Task 8	Repeat as above for winter.
Task 9	Repeat as above for spring.
Task 10	<p>Make a front cover and blurb for their seasons books. Remember the front needs to include the title of your book (Seasons), a picture and the name of the author (your name!). The blurb can also include the title and a picture. Then you need to write some sentences which give the reader an idea of what the book is about.</p> <p>Share them with the people you live so they can find out more about the seasons too.</p>
