<b>EYFS</b> This term the children have been learning the story Dear Santa. They have practised retelling the story using signifiers and actions and have even done some Christmas baking, which was delicious. The children have had lots of fun writing letters to Santa, creating Christmas decorations and have even had a virtual visit from Santa. Santa also sent the children in EYFS an elf this half term. The children voted and named the elf Numberblock. Numberblock has been up to lots of mischief in the classroom and the children have loved coming in each day to see where he is and what he has been doing. He even broke his arm the last week because he had a party after the children had gone home!	Year 4 have been focusing on the Romans. They have studied in detail about the volcanic eruption in Pompeii in 79AD. This has produced some amazing written work where they have created a diary entry pretending they were in Pompeii as the volcano erupted. They used a range of skills that they have learned this half term, including fronted adverbials. This led onto writing a newspaper report where the pupils included both direct and indirect speech in their writing. Well done Y4 for amazing focus and perseverance to create such incredible and detailed work. Your teachers are proud of you!
Year 1 The children have painted an advent board that was placed at Beverley Minster. Two of our children were also interviewed on the radio about what we did on our board.	Year 5 have been busy this half term. We have gained certificates in Bikeability; took part in drama workshops which led to a virtual performance of Mary Poppins; took part in virtual Sirius West transition days; had our artwork displayed in Beverley Mister as part of the Advent Project, and virtually interviewed authors, Tony Bradman and Phil Earle.
Year 2 have really enjoyed learning about Florence Nightingale as well as The Great Fire of London this term. They have learned about key historical figures of that time and have worked hard writing newspaper reports of the great fire. They have developed their scientific enquiry skills as they investigated different everyday materials. They have had lots of fun settling back into school life. Mrs Clark and Mrs Harvatt look forward to welcoming the children back in the new year!	
Year 3 have taken part in dance and drama work- shops with the Children's University based on Mary Poppins. They acted out different characters from the film and sang and performed a fantastic version of Chim chiminee and Supercalifragilistict and showed great acting, dance and singing abilities!	Year 6 have taken part in Bikeability this term, gaining practical skills and understanding how to cycle safely on today's roads. The children have also been working hard in English and maths.
