Dear Parent/Carer

We would like to welcome you all back after the summer holidays. We are really pleased to see everyone back in school and eager to learn. Last week the children returned to school with a fantastic attitude to their learning and being back with their friends. Thank you very much for ensuring the children look smart in their uniforms and are arriving at school on time. They have all made an excellent start to the new academic year.

<u>Timings</u>

The school gates open at 8.40 am every morning and teachers are in classrooms waiting for the children from this time. Registration is now at the earlier time of 8.45 am so all children must be in their classrooms by this time for the register. Anyone who arrives after this time will be classed at late. Any pupils who arrive after 8.45 am must be signed in by an adult at the school office. We are now using an electronic system to record pupils' attendance at school.

Lunch time is from 12.00 noon until 12.50 pm. School now finishes at the slightly later time of 3.15 pm.

Attendance

As you all know, we are working hard to improve the attendance across the school. Attendance at school is extremely important for supporting children's wellbeing and overall development. As you will have all heard in the media, the Government has been explicit in its intention to ensure excellent attendance at school for all children. This information was published in its document 'Working together to improve school attendance'. The expectation is clear: that every child should attend every session when the school is open. However, we do recognise that there will be exceptional times when it is not possible to attend school due to illness etc. When a child's attendance becomes a concern, Mrs Chaytor, who is the school's Safeguarding and Attendance Lead, will be in contact with parents to arrange a meeting. It is every parent's responsibility to ensure their children attend school regularly.

<u>Uniform</u>

As it's the start of a new term and a new academic year we are having a review of our school uniform to ensure that all pupils are wearing this. It is the expectation of the school that all children wear the specified school uniform, every day, and that they have the stated PE kit. Sandshoes are also part of the school uniform and must be provided for children to wear inside.

We are supporting our families with the cost of living crisis by ensuring our school uniform is as simple as possible and we also have the uniform swap shop where uniform items can be taken free of charge. This is located within the Eco Pantry but if you would like to get some free uniform from us, please contact Mrs Brear in the school office. We have an abundance of spare jumpers and cardigans and many of these are like brand new.

Please ensure all uniform is clearly named so that any found items can be returned to their owner.

<u>Jewellery</u>

In the interest of safety, children must not wear jewellery in school. If a child has recently pierced ears and they are unable to remove their earrings, they must wear plain studs only and these must be taped over during PE lessons.

Information regarding uniform and jewellery is stated on the school website and is a requirement of the school.

Reading

Teaching the children to read is a priority for the school and to help us with this we need to continued support of all our parents. Please ensure that you read with your child at least 4 times a week and return their reading record to school. All children who read 4 times a week will have their names included in the weekly reading prize draw and will be in with a chance of winning a fantastic book to take home and keep. Regular reading helps children to become more confident and fluent.
