<u>EYFS</u>

This half term in EYFS our topic has been 'Down on the Farm'. We have been identifying animals and their babies and deciding if they always look the same. We have been reading Owl Babies and we invented our own story call Bear Babies. Even though the weather has been a little icy and cold we have spent a lot of time outside exploring the ice and watching what happens to water overnight as it gets cold. In PE we have been exploring dance, we have created performances alongside some familiar tales such as Goldilocks and The 3 Little Pigs.

<u>YEAR 1</u>

This half term, our Year 1 topic has been 'Into the Blue'. In writing, we have written our own recount of our school trip to The Deep and have spent a lot of time looking at word classes. Our maths topic has been place value within 20 and we have also begun to look at addition and subtraction. In geography, we have been finding and locating the different continents and oceans. We have looked at the Arctic and Antarctica, comparing the landscape and identifying what types of natural features we might find. One of the highlights of our half term was our school trip to The Deep where we found out about new creatures and their habitats. We had a lot of fun exploring. In science we have looked at living things and their habitats. We also found out about food chains and how we can stay healthy as humans. In PE, we have been doing dance lessons and finding the beat to music as well as showing agility. Dreams and goals was our topic for PSHE and we have spent time learning a new goal as well as creating a garden of dreams.



We have shown good team-work and determination throughout these lessons. Next half term we are looking forward to our DT topic of making our own mechanisms.

<u>YEAR 2</u>

This half term Year 2 have been diving into our 'Into the Blue' theme. We have learnt all about countries within the Arctic Circle in geography, comparing the North Pole and South Pole. This linked to our school trip to The Deep where we took part in a 'My Polar Home' workshop learning all about the different animals that live in the coldest places on Earth and their features. As part of our theme we have also explored the world's oceans in geography and looked at food chains and habitats in science. In writing we are currently writing a recount of our trip to The Deep! We are working hard on using verbs and adverbs in our work as well as the most important basic skills. We have worked extremely hard with our handwriting too which shows in our books! We have been tackling the tricky topic of money in maths looking at the different coins and notes and the value of them. Year 2 have worked super hard this half term. \bigcirc

YEAR 3

It has been a very busy half term for year 3. In writing we have used the story 'Where the Wild Things Are' to create our own amazing portal stories. In geography we have been looking closely at our local area. We have visited the local area to look at physical and human features and have then created our own maps of the local area. As we live in a residential area, one of the human features we have identified were lots of schools. As a class we asked other children around the school how they travel to and from school and created bar charts to represent this. We continued our work on map skills and created maps of our dream area. In science we have been exploring forces. We enjoyed a wonderful trip to Magna to support our understanding of forces. The children have loved working with magnets and learning about magnetism. We have continued to work on our times tables knowledge throughout the half term in maths and the children have also worked on multiplying and dividing 2 digit numbers by 1 digit numbers.

<u>YEAR 5</u>

In Year 5, we have been mastering long multiplication and short division, as well as learning how to multiply fractions and find fractions of amounts. We have been learning all about Earth and Space in science and further enhanced this with our anchor novel 'George's Secret Key to the Universe', which we have been using to develop our inference and summarising skills, as well as supplementing this with linked space-related texts. We have been working really hard on our handwriting, spelling and grammar, as well as writing our own dialogue story. In PE, we have been learning how to count in beats and bars to create different dynamics of movements and sequences in our dance unit, as well as continuing to piece together our Samba music arrangement in our percussion lessons with Mr Higley. In geography, we have been comparing Hull and the Grand Canyon whilst learning about biomes and climate zones, whilst in computing we have been getting to grips with using Crumble software to program different sequences and colours of lights using selection and conditions. In PSHE lessons, we have been exploring different careers and what steps they require to enter them, as well as discussing which ones contribute different things to our society. In French, we have learned how to describe the weather and finally, in RE we have been exploring faith founders and different influencers on people's beliefs.

<u>YEAR 6</u>

Year 6 have had another busy half term. In reading, we have loved 'The Explorer' and immersing ourselves in the adventures of Con, Lila, Max and Fred in the Amazon Rainforest. We've loved the action and drama but could have survived without the tarantulas, grubs and emptying intestines! In writing, we have focused on our model text of 'The Roar' and written our own journey stories which were inspired by 'The Explorer'. In maths, we continued working on our arithmetic skills and have mastered geometry - especially measuring and classifying angles. In geography, we have been learning about the Caribbean, ownership of islands, where the islands are located and the human and physical geography of the region.

Did you know only 2% of the islands are inhabited?! In science, we have learnt about light, shadows and how we see. We thoroughly enjoyed our trip to Magna exploring the different pavilions/ zones and our workshop where we made shadow puppets and laser mazes with mirrors.

As you all know, attendance and punctuality at school is crucial for children's learning and development and wellbeing. All the children are working really hard to ensure they are at school every day and look forward to all the rewards and incentives we have in place for excellent attendance. We are really excited to announce that due to our close links with Hull FC we have been lucky enough to receive some season passes and we will be using these to reward excellent attendance at school. The first tickets will be given out in the assembly on Friday and are for the game on 15th February between Hull FC and Hull KR!

<u>Website</u>


